Intro & History of Nobel Prize

It set of annual international awards bestowed in several categories by Swedish and Norwegian institutions in recognition of academic, cultural, or scientific advances.

The will of the Swedish chemist, engineer and industrialist Alfred Nobel established the five Nobel prizes in 1895.

The prizes in Chemistry, Literature, Peace, Physics, and Physiology or Medicine were first awarded in 1901.

The Prize in Economic Sciences was created in 1968 by Sweden's central bank (Sveriges Riksbank) in Memory of Alfred Nobel. It began in 1969

Awarded for Outstanding contributions for humanity in:

- Physics
- Chemistry
- Physiology or medicine
- Literature
- Peace
- Economic sciences (Sveriges Riksbank Prize in Economic Sciences in Memory of Alfred Nobel)





14 laureates were awarded a Nobel Prize in 2022

Awarding Countries:

- Sweden (all prizes except the Peace Prize)
- Norway (Peace Prize only)

Awarding Institutions:

- Royal Swedish Academy of Sciences (Chemistry, Economic Sciences, Physics)
- Nobel Assembly at the Karolinska Institute (Physiology or Medicine)
- Swedish Academy (Literature)
- Norwegian Nobel Committee (Peace)

Facts on Nobel Prize

- Awarded Nobel Prize in Chemistry twice:
 - Frederick Sanger (in 1958 and 1980)
 - K. Barry Sharpless have been (2001, 2022)
- Awarded Nobel Prize in Physics twice:
 - J. Bardeen (1956, 1972)
- The only person with two unshared Nobel Prizes Linus Pauling
 - 1954 Nobel Prize in Chemistry
 - 1962 Nobel Peace Prize.
- In 2014, **Malala Yousafzai** became the youngest Nobel laureate to win the Nobel Peace Prize, at the age of 17

The Nobel Prize amount for 2022 is set at Swedish kronor (SEK) 10.0 million per full Nobel Prize.


- Between 1901 and 2022, the Nobel Prizes and the prize in economic sciences were awarded 615 times.
- Between 1901 and 2022 the Nobel Prize and prize in economic sciences have been awarded 61 times to women.
- Two Nobel Prize laureates declined the prize
 - Jean-Paul Sartre, awarded the 1964 Nobel Prize in Literature
 - Le Duc Tho, awarded the 1973 Nobel Peace Prize jointly with US Secretary of State Henry Kissinger.
- In no case may a prize amount be divided between more than three persons




